hanging floral arrangement

Most people forget to look up when they're decorating a dining setting for a special occasion, but what a missed opportunity! Feast your eyes on the floral fantasy hangling over the table here. It brings a celestial feeling and is practically a piece of art — one that looks a million bucks. It's also a great holiday hack because it's not too tricky to put together. Bonnie's sons helped her make this one.

YOU'LL NEED

- + A ladder towel rail We got ours from Ikea, but lots of home stores stock them. If you already have one in your bathroom or bedroom, hijack it for the holidays and make this hack even cheaper!
- + Mixture of foliage: faux + dried + real from the garden We used dried paim leaves and pampas grass for their dramatic shape and interest.

- + Plant ties and plastic ties You'll need a few packets as there's a lot going on here.
- + Pergola For mounting the finished ladder.
- + Rope For hanging the ladder.

HERE'S HOW YOU DO IT

- 1 Lay the ladder flat on the ground.
- **2** Tie the plants to one side of the ladder, starting with the largest and most architectural pieces of foliage.
- **3** Keep going until you're happy with how it's looking, and you can't see any of the ladder through the plants.
- **4** Loop the rope around the ladder and then tie it securely decorated side down to the pergola, centred above the table. Enjoy your meal underneath this glorious creation!

HOT TIP Pile crushed ice into a giant clamshell and you have a stunning serving platter. Bring on the shellfish!

YOU HAD ME AT HELLO! Welcome your guests with a pretty-as-a-picture mocktail. Bundaberg Pink Grapefruit (ginger beer) + pink fairy floss (cotton candy) + edible flowers = a mocktail you'll have to fight the kids for. These saucer-style glasses are perfectly suited to serving champers or cocktails, and we feel just a touch fancier drinking out of them, too. Ooh la la!

sweet & simple mantel

This green garland (top right) is ridiculously easy to pull together and looks gorgeous atop any mantelpiece.

YOU'LL NEED

- + A decent amount of greenery Either real or fake.
- + Wire mesh Cut into a long strip that is slightly narrower than the width of the mantelpiece.
- + Twist ties Or plant ties.
- + A few white candles Of varying heights (but see our warning below).

HERE'S HOW YOU DO IT

- ${\bf 1} \, {\hbox{Thread your greenery through the wire mesh and}} \,$ secure it with the ties so that you have a long runner of greenery.
- $\boldsymbol{2}$ Place the garland on the mantelpiece and arrange the candles around it.
- 3 Drape the garland down the sides of the mantel for even more drama.

A WORD TO THE WISE The shorter candles are purely decorative. Don't light them unless you want an actual fire burning on top of the mantel. #griswolds
